The LEC Eventing Derby Series

Thank you to everyone that came out to the Eventing Derby No# 2 on May 28, 2015. Without the Volunteers the event could not go on, and without the competitors the event would not go on. It was great to see riders in from Alabama, Mississippi and Florida as well as Louisiana.

The Eventing Derby Series was designed to give riders and horses more challenge as they progress through the different levels of competition. Combining the stadium fences and cross country fences requires the horse to pay more attention to the rider. Most seasoned horses will get out on the cross country phase ready to gallop...and then they find out it's not that straight forward!

The first Eventing Derby, stadium fences were set up on level terrain. The March

28th Eventing Derby, stadium fences were set on a little more rolling terrain that required more than just "point and shoot." The riders needed to rebalance going slightly downhill or uphill to the next stadium fence. Something that doesn't happen in the show ring! Both the very beginner levels as well as the upper levels did well getting their horses around a course of 12 to 18 consecutive fences!

One of the most widely sought after three-day Eventing clinicians in the U.S. is conducting a two-day clinic focusing on cross country, show jumping and gymnastic exercises. The clinic will be hosted by **Lagniappe Equestrian Center located in Folsom, Louisiana.** The clinic is offering, three 2 hour sessions per day.

JIM WOFFORD

Jim was a member of the 1968, 1972 and 1980 U.S.
Olympic Equestrian Team, winning two team silver medals and one individual silver medal. He also competed in the 1970 and 1978 World Championships, winning individual and team bronze medals. He won the U.S. National Championships five times on five different horses and won or placed at many competitions abroad between 1959 and 1986. In 2000 Jim was listed by the Chronicle of the Horse as one of the "50 Most Influential Horseman" of the 20th century, and in January of 2012 he was awarded the Jimmy A. Williams Trophy for Lifetime Achievement, horse's sports' highest honor. Widely sought after as a clinician and coach, Jim is equally well known as an author.
